

In Flanders Fields

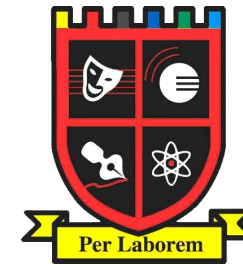
