1. Know the key facts about Abraham: where he was born, his father's name, and where his family moved.		
2. Be able to explain what a covenant is and what vocation means.		
3. Understand the story of Charles Blondin and how it connects to faith and trust.		
4. Know the main details of the story of Hagar in Genesis 16: her nationality, how her attitude changed, what she did when mistreated, and the name of her son.		
5. Know the two countries with the largest Jewish populations and two ways someone can become a Jew.		
6. Know the terms for Jews who are strict in their beliefs and those who take a more relaxed approach.		
7. Know the names for key Jewish items and symbols: Torah scrolls, mitzvot, number of mitzvot, Jewish religious symbols, first Jew, the cap worn by Jewish men.		
8. Know the key features of the synagogue: what is kept in the Ark, where the Ark is located, what a yad is, the lamp at the front, why it stays lit, and what happens at the Bimah.		
9. Be able to describe how Jewish families practise their religion at home.		
10. Know at least eight major events in Martin Luther King Jr's life for a timeline.		
11. Understand why the Torah is important for Jews, how it is used, and how it is respected.		
12. Know what segregation laws were and how they affected African Americans.		
13. Understand the events and impact of the Montgomery Bus Boycott.		
14. Know why the March on Washington was a turning point and the two major laws passed as a result of the Civil Rights Movement.		
15. Understand why MLK supported non-violence and why his work still matters today.
